ਸ੍ਰੀ ਗੁਰੂ ਅੰਗਦ ਦੇਵ ਜੀ ਨੇ ਖਡੂਰ ਸਾਹਿਬ ਦੀ ਧਰਤੀ ਨੂੰ ਸਿੱਖ ਧਰਮ ਦੇ ਅਧਿਆਤਮਕ ਪ੍ਰਚਾਰ ਲਈ ਚੁਣਿਆ ਅਤੇ ਗੁਰਮੁਖੀ ਲਿਪੀ ਨੂੰ ਅਜੋਕੀ ਤਰਤੀਬ ਦਿੰਦਿਆਂ ਹੋਇਆਂ ਬੱਚਿਆਂ ਲਈ ਬਾਲ-ਬੋਧ ਤਿਆਰ ਕੀਤੇ। ਇੰਝ ਖਡੂਰ ਸਾਹਿਬ ਸਿੱਖ ਜਗਤ ਵਿੱਚ ਰੂਹਾਨੀ ਵਿਦਿਆ ਪ੍ਰਦਾਨ ਕਰਨ ਵਾਲੇ ਪਹਿਲੇ ਕੇਂਦਰ ਵਜੋਂ ਸਥਾਪਿਤ ਹੋਇਆ।

ਸ੍ਰੀ ਗੁਰੂ ਨਾਨਕ ਦੇਵ ਜੀ ਦੇ 500 ਸਾਲਾ ਪ੍ਰਕਾਸ਼ ਦਿਹਾੜੇ ਦੇ ਸ਼ੁਭ ਅਵਸਰ 'ਤੇ ਸੰਤ ਬਾਬਾ ਉੱਤਮ ਸਿੰਘ ਜੀ ਨੇ ਗੁਰਸਿੱਖੀ ਦੇ ਉੱਚੇ ਅਸੂਲਾਂ ਨੂੰ ਵਿਦਿਆਰਥੀਆਂ ਦੀ ਜੀਵਨ-ਸ਼ੈਲੀ ਦਾ ਹਿੱਸਾ ਬਣਾਉਣ ਲਈ ਸ੍ਰੀ ਗੁਰੂ ਅੰਗਦ ਦੇਵ ਕਾਲਜ ਦੀ ਸਥਾਪਨਾ ਕੀਤੀ ਸੀ। ਜਿਹੜੇ ਸਮਿਆਂ ਵਿੱਚ ਕਾਲਜ ਦੀ ਸਥਾਪਨਾ ਕੀਤੀ ਗਈ ਸੀ, ਉਸ ਸਮੇਂ ਕਾਲਜ ਰੂਪ ਵਿਦਿਆ ਦੇ ਕੇਂਦਰ ਬਹੁਤ ਦੂਰ ਦੂਰ ਸਨ। ਆਵਾਜਾਈ ਦੀਆਂ ਸਹੂਲਤਾਂ ਨਹੀਂ ਸਨ। ਲੜਕੀਆਂ ਖਾਸਕਰ ਪਿੰਡਾਂ ਦੀਆਂ ਲੜਕੀਆਂ ਨੂੰ ਉੱਚ ਵਿਦਿਆ ਦਿਵਾਉਣ ਦਾ ਰਿਵਾਜ ਨਹੀਂ ਸੀ। ਅਜਿਹੇ ਮਾਹੌਲ ਵਿੱਚ ਬਾਬਾ ਉੱਤਮ ਸਿੰਘ ਜੀ ਵੱਲੋਂ ਬਾਲਿਆ ਗਿਆ ਵਿਦਿਆ ਦਾ ਦੀਵਾ ਅੱਜ ਵੀ ਲਟ ਲਟ ਬਲ ਰਿਹਾ ਹੈ। ਭਾਵੇਂ ਉੱਚ ਕੋਟੀ ਦੇ ਮੁਕਾਬਲੇ ਹੋਣ, ਇਮਤਿਹਾਨ ਹੋਣ, ਖੇਡਾਂ ਹੋਣ, ਸਹਾਇਕ ਗਤੀਵਿਧੀਆਂ ਹੋਣ, ਕਾਲਜ ਹਰ ਖੇਤਰ ਵਿੱਚ ਵਿਲੱਖਣ ਪਛਾਣ ਬਣਾ ਚੁੱਕਾ ਹੈ।

ਧਾਰਮਿਕਤਾ ਮਨੁੱਖ ਨੂੰ ਅਨੁਸ਼ਾਸਨਬੱਧ ਰੱਖਦੀ ਹੈ। ਮਨੁੱਖ ਨੂੰ ਉਸਦੇ ਜੀਵਨ ਦੇ ਅਸਲੀ ਆਸ਼ੇ ਪ੍ਰਤੀ ਚੇਤਨ ਰੱਖਦੀ ਹੈ। ਉਪਭੋਗਤਾਵਾਦ ਦਾ ਸ਼ਿਕਾਰ ਹੋਣ ਤੋਂ ਬਚਾਉਂਦੀ ਹੈ। ਮਨੁੱਖਤਾ ਨੂੰ ਇਨਸਾਨੀਅਤ ਦੇ ਮਾਰਗ 'ਤੇ ਤੇਰਦੀ ਹੈ। ਇਸ ਲਈ ਕਾਲਜ ਦਾ ਮਾਹੌਲ ਸ਼ੁਰੂ ਤੋਂ ਹੀ ਧਾਰਮਿਕਤਾ ਤੋਂ ਪ੍ਰਭਾਵਿਤ ਰਿਹਾ ਹੈ। ਆਲ ਦੁਆਲਾ ਸਾਫ਼ ਤੇ ਸ਼ੁੱਧ ਰੱਖਣਾ, ਤਨ ਮਨ ਸੁੱਚਾ ਤੇ ਦਿਮਾਗ ਰੌਸ਼ਨ ਰੱਖਣਾ ਕਾਲਜ ਦਾ ਉਦੇਸ਼ ਰਿਹਾ ਹੈ। ਇਸ ਲਈ ਕਾਲਜ ਦੀ ਪ੍ਰਬੰਧਕੀ ਕਮੇਟੀ ਵੱਲੋਂ ਕਾਰ ਸੇਵਾ ਖਡੂਰ ਸਾਹਿਬ ਰਾਹੀਂ ਵਾਤਾਵਰਨ ਨੂੰ ਸੰਭਾਲਣ ਦੇ ਵਿਸ਼ੇਸ਼ ਉਪਰਾਲੇ ਕੀਤੇ ਜਾ ਰਹੇ ਹਨ। ਕਾਰ ਸੇਵਾ ਖਡੂਰ ਸਾਹਿਬ ਇਸ ਕਾਰਜ ਵੱਲ ਵਸੀਹ ਪੱਧਰ 'ਤੇ ਧਿਆਨ ਦਿੰਦਿਆਂ ਹੋਇਆਂ ਜਿੱਥੇ 550 ਜੰਗਲ ਲਾਉਣ ਦੇ ਟੀਚੇ ਵੱਲ ਤੇਜ਼ੀ ਨਾਲ ਵਧ ਰਿਹਾ ਹੈ, ਉੱਥੇ ਸੜਕਾਂ ਦੇ ਦੋਵੇਂ ਪਾਸੇ ਛਾਂ-ਦਾਰ ਦਰਖਤ ਲਾਉਣ ਦੀ ਵੱਡੀ ਮੁਹਿੰਮ ਵੀ ਚਲਾਈ ਜਾ ਰਹੀ ਹੈ। ਇਸ ਸੇਚ ਨੂੰ ਵਿਦਿਆਰਥੀਆਂ ਦੀ ਕਾਰਜ-ਸ਼ੈਲੀ ਦਾ ਹਿੱਸਾ ਬਣਾਉਣ ਲਈ ਕਾਲਜ ਵਿਖੇ ਵੀ ਅਜਿਹਾ ਹਰਿਆ-ਭਰਿਆ ਵਾਤਾਵਰਨ ਮੁਹੱਈਆ ਕਰਵਾਇਆ ਗਿਆ ਹੈ, ਜਿਸ ਨੂੰ ਵੇਖ ਕੇ ਵਿਦਿਆਰਥੀਆਂ ਵਿੱਚ ਵਾਤਾਵਰਨ ਦੀ ਸੁਚੱਜੀ ਸੰਭਾਲ ਦਾ ਅਹਿਸਾਸ ਉਤਪੰਨ ਹੋ ਸਕੇ।

ਅੱਠ ਗੁਰੂ ਸਾਹਿਬਾਨ ਦੀ ਚਰਨ ਛੋਹ ਪ੍ਰਾਪਤ ਖਡੂਰ ਸਾਹਿਬ ਦੀ ਧਰਤੀ 'ਤੇ ਸ੍ਰੀ ਗੁਰੂ ਅੰਗਦ ਦੇਵ ਜੀ ਨੇ ਜਿੱਥੇ ਮੱਲ ਅਖਾੜਾ ਦੀ ਸ਼ੁਰੂਆਤ ਕੀਤੀ, ਉੱਥੇ ਗੁਰਮੁਖੀ ਲਿਪੀ ਨੂੰ ਅਜੋਕੀ ਤਰਤੀਬ ਦੇਣ ਦੇ ਨਾਲ ਨਾਲ ਪਹਿਲਾ ਬਾਲ-ਬੋਧ ਸਿਰਜ ਕੇ ਪੰਜਾਬੀ ਭਾਸ਼ਾ ਨੂੰ ਅਮੀਰੀ ਬਖਸ਼ੀ। ਇਸੇ ਖਿੱਤੇ ਉੱਤੇ ਸ੍ਰੀ ਗੁਰੂ ਅੰਗਦ ਦੇਵ ਕਾਲਜ ਵਰਗੀ ਉੱਚ ਤੇ ਮਿਆਰੀ ਵਿਦਿਆ ਪ੍ਰਦਾਨ ਕਰਨ ਵਾਲੇ ਇੱਕ ਵੱਕਾਰੀ ਸੰਸਥਾ ਦਾ ਹੋਣਾ ਆਪਣੇ ਆਪ ਵਿੱਚ ਬਹੁਤ ਮਹੱਤਵਪੂਰਨ ਹੈ। ਇਹ ਕਾਲਜ ਗੁਰੂ ਸਾਹਿਬਾਨ ਦੇ ਪਾਏ ਪੁਰਨਿਆਂ ਦੀ ਰੌਸ਼ਨੀ ਵਿੱਚ ਵਿੱਦਿਆ ਦਾ ਪ੍ਰਚਾਰ ਤੇ ਪ੍ਰਸਾਰ ਕਰ ਰਿਹਾ ਹੈ।

Prohibition, Prevention & Punishment for Ragging

Prohibition of Ragging

1. No person shall practice ragging in any form within or outside the premises of an educational institution.
2. Any person who indulge in ragging on conviction, may be punished with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to three years or with fine, which may extend to fifty thousand rupees or both.

Preliminary Enquiry/Action

3. (i) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parents or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution or an Officer-in-Charge makes a complaint, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational Institution, the head of that educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within twenty-four hours of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into it and, if, *prima facie*, it is found true, suspend the student found guilty.
- (ii) Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational Institution, it is proved that *prima facie* there is no substance in the complaint received; he shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant.
4. Every single incident of ragging where the victim or his parents or guardian or the head of educational Institution is not satisfied with the institutional arrangement of action, a First Information Report (FIR) shall be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.

Offence to be cognizable, non-bailable and compoundable

5. (1) Any student convicted of an offence under this Ordinance shall be expelled from the educational institution.
- (i) Student expelled on account of ragging shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion.

Note: As per the UGC Regulations ID.O.No.1-15/2009 (ARC) pt, III, dated October 16, 2020, is mandatory for the student and his/her parents to submit an on anti-ragging affidavit at www.antiragging.in at the time of admission

GENERAL RULES FOR HOSTEL ADMISSION

1. All rights of admission to the Hostels will be reserved with the Administration and are implemented according to the rules and policies of the institute and any other law enacting agency such as University, Grants Commission, MHRD or appropriate. Every hosteller and his/her Parents/Guardian have to sign an affidavit issued by UGC regarding prevention of Ragging along with admission form.
2. Admission to the Hostel will be made afresh in every academic session. The hostel admission shall be executed after submission of the duly filled application form (FORM-A), requisite fee and undertakings (Annexures I and II), given in the Hostel Prospectus. The Hostel Prospectus is available on the institute website and/or a hard copy may be obtained from the office where admission to a course is sought. The information provided by the student (especially the home address & contact details) is to be authenticated/verified by the respective coordinators of the different wings/college and Principals, who are handling the admission process of their institution and the allocation will be made accordingly. In case the information given by the student is found wrong, the concerned student/s shall be debarred from allocation of hostel accommodation.
3. Ordinarily, the hostel accommodation shall be provided on the basis of the distance between the place of residence of the student and /college. i.e., the student living farther from the place of study will get preference. The Boys and Girls whose residence is within 40 kilometres and 25 kilometres, respectively from SGAD College will not be entitled for accommodation in the hostel. *However, this condition shall not apply to students who are admitted to a purely residential course or a course wherein hostel accommodation is absolutely necessary such as NDA, CDS etc.*
4. While the returning students who were residents of the hostels in the previous session, shall get hostels on priority upon payment of academic and hostel fee, the students admitted in previous academic sessions who could not get hostels that year due to non-availability of some other reason shall be considered alongside the new students admitted in the new session.
5. If results of the previous class examination are not yet declared, admission to the hostel shall be provisional, to be confirmed later, upon declaration of the result and subject to having passed the qualifying/previous examination.
6. A student, who violates the rules of the Hostel or causes indiscipline, may be fined and /or rusticated from the Hostel/Institute. Likewise, if a student indulges in violent activity, he/she will be immediately suspended from the Hostel and his/her entry to the Hostel will be banned. He/She may be suspended from the course as well. In case of non-compliance, a committee consisting of the following shall investigate the case and recommend some other punishment too.
 - (A) Baba Sewa Singh Ji or his nominee (Chairman)
 - (B) Director/coordinator of the concerned Wing of SGAD College/Principal of the College Hostel Warden
 - (C) Secretary, SGAD College
 - (D) Any other member nominated by Baba Sewa Singh ji

7. The following rules shall apply to the hostel residents:

- (i) Hostel routines (Annexure-III) shall be strictly followed by the residents except NDA/CDS students who may have a different Daily/Sunday/Holiday routines provided by the corresponding Director/Wing coordinator/College or Principal.
- (ii) While residing in hostel, the resident will not be allowed to take up any job.
- (iii) The residents may be asked to share the rooms.
- (iv) Admission in the Hostel shall be cancelled and security deposit forfeited if false is recorded in the Hostel admission form.
- (v) Ignorance of Hostel rules will not be taken as an excuse for avoiding any disciplinary action.
- (vi) No guest is allowed to stay in the hostel during night. However, under unavoidable circumstances the Grand Parents/Parents/Siblings can be given permission to stay in the Sarai depending upon the availability of accommodation. A proof of relationship has to be submitted by hostel resident. Ordinarily, the guest shall not be permitted to stay in the Sarai for more than two days. Violation of the above rule may attract a fine of Rs. 5000/- and repeating the same may lead to a higher quantum of fine and/or expulsion from the hostel. The security deposit may also be confiscated.
- (vii) No Hostel Resident shall be allowed to change his/her room during the session in normal circumstances.
- (viii) The authorities reserve the right to get the hostels vacated only under unavoidable circumstances.
- (ix) Hostel Residents are prohibited to take the furniture from any other room, canteen or mess to their allotted room.
- (x) Before vacating the hostel, a hostel resident shall obtain the necessary clearance from the Hostel warden and shall personally hand over the charge of the room and other hostel properties to the authorities. He/she shall personally be responsible for the loss and damage of the Hostel property and shall also pay for the repairs of damage caused to the furniture fixtures/fittings, etc.
- (xi) A hostel resident will be required to vacate the room within a week after his/her examination is over. No extension will be given to any hostel resident except for an academic assignment, which should be the part of the syllabus/training. An overstay he/she shall attract a fine of Rs. 100/- per day. If he/she fails to vacate the hostel within the specified period then he/she would be declared to be having unauthorized possession, which will lead to his/her expulsion from the hostel. His/her lock shall be broken under video graphic recording, in the presence of the following committee and the room thus opened, shall be considered as vacated from that very day.
 - (A) Director/coordinator of the concerned Wing of SGAD College/Principal of the College/
 - (B) Hostel Warden
 - (C) Secretary, SGAD College/
 - (D) Security officer
- (xii) Hostel residents are advised to keep the identity documents always with them and should produce the same whenever asked by the concerned authorities.
- (xiii) The residents can meet the Warden in the office during the specified time for official work.

- (xiv) Hostel residents are cautioned not to keep cash, ornaments, Mobile Phones, Laptops, and other valuable/costly articles in their rooms, unattended. The authorities will not be responsible for their safety and any kind of loss/theft.
- (xv) No Hostel Resident is allowed to keep car. Hostel Residents shall park their cycles, scooters, motorbikes etc. in the designated parking space and nowhere else. Defaulter shall be fined Rs. 500/- per incident. They will get their vehicles insured against such loss or theft.

8. Indiscipline, misbehaviour (including with hostel staff and security guards) and gambling in the premises of the Hostel or the hostel room are strictly prohibited. Violations of the above may lead to disciplinary action, imposition of fine (minimum Rs. 5000/-) and even eviction from hostel.

9. Keeping arms/weapon/ammunition in the hostel premises or the hostel room are strictly prohibited. Violations of the above will lead to strict disciplinary action, imposition of fine and even eviction from hostel. Similarly, consuming/keeping alcohol/Hooka/Tobacco/any other intoxicants in the hostel premises or the hostel room by hostel resident and their guests is strictly prohibited. Resident who violates the above will be fined Rs. 5000/- and repeating the same may lead to severe fine and even eviction from hostel.

A committee consisting of the following may occasionally search the premises/rooms/Almirahs etc. to keep a strict vigil.

- (A) Director/coordinator of the concerned Wing of SGAD College/Principal of the College/
- (B) Hostel Warden
- (C) Secretary, SGAD College/
- (D) Security officer

10. Every hostel resident will make sure that before leaving the hostel room, he/she switches off the lights and the fan. If he/she fails to do so, he/she will be fined Rs. 200/- per day.

11. No hostel resident is allowed to cook food or prepare tea in his/her room. Using/keeping electrical appliances such as Iron (press), Induction plates, kettles, heaters, heating rod, geyser and radio/stereo etc. is strictly prohibited. If a hostel resident is caught having any such electric gadget, then he/she will be fined Rs. 500/- per gadget and the gadget will be confiscated from the resident. If the hostel resident repeats the same mistake, the fine will be doubled each time and may even cause eviction from hostel.

12. Hostel resident shall not damage any type of hostel property including electric, sanitary items installed in the hostel. If he/she does so, then the repair cost along with a fine of Rs. 500/- will be recovered from him/her. If the hostel resident repeats the same mistake, the fine will be doubled each time and may even cause eviction from hostel.

13. The hostel residents will sleep in their own rooms. A hosteller cannot sleep in another room without prior permission of the warden.

14. Large gatherings or meetings are not allowed in the hostel premises without the permission of the Warden.

15. Hostel residents will make proper use of TV, newspapers, magazines, and indoor games provided in the common rooms. Hostel warden will fix the timings of the common rooms and a common room committee will be appointed to look after their functioning. Eatables, snacks, tea etc., are strictly prohibited in the common room.
16. Hostel residents will wear proper dress while going to the common room, dining hall, guest room, and office or while roaming about on the campus. If a student ignores the warning of the Attendants/Warden, he/she will be subjected to disciplinary action that may include eviction from the Hostel.
17. A hostel resident must mark his/her leave in leave register and fill leave proforma for going home and submit it in the hostel office. The name of the hostel resident who is continuously absent for more than one week, shall be struck off the rolls and the possession of his/her room will be taken by the Warden.
18. Hostel residents will ensure that their guests (if any) behave properly with the security guards. If they fail to do so, then they can be asked to vacate the hostel room.
19. In case of non-payment of the hostel dues, the warden can get the room vacated after informing the respective coordinator.
20. Only males are allowed to enter the Boys' hostel rooms. Similarly, in girls hostel only females would be allowed to enter the hostel room.
21. Before commencement of the examinations, hostel residents will clear their dues and obtain a "No Dues" slip from the Hostel Warden. Only then University/Board roll number shall be issued.
22. In Boys' hostels resident's entry/exit is allowed as per the Daily/Sunday Routines/schedules. For entry/exit timings, the respective coordinators/Principals/Wardens may be contacted. The duration of time during exams can be extended for boys only with the prior permission of the competent authority.
23. If the Parents/Guardians of the Hostel Resident don't respond to the call of authorities in an emergent situation, the entire responsibility would fall upon the Parents/Guardians.
24. If any student is found stealing in the hostel, strict disciplinary action will be taken against him/her. He/She can be expelled immediately from the Hostel.
25. If any student is suffering from serious chronic disease, he/she must fill the same in the hostel admission form. He/she will be allotted accommodation in the hostel only on recommendation of a medical officer as per rules.
26. In the hostel premises, delivery of cooked food/fast food is strictly prohibited. Any hostel resident violating this rule will be immediately expelled from the hostel.
27. More rules may apply from time to time.

SPECIAL RULES FOR GIRLS HOSTEL

1. At the time of admission to the Hostel, Parents /Guardian should accompany their daughter. They will submit a list of relatives who are to be allowed to meet their child/ward.
2. Only authorized guests shall be allowed to meet the Hostel Resident in the Guest Room situated within the four walls of the Hostel. Authorized guests can meet the Hostel Resident on all Saturday and Sundays from 10.00 AM to 5.00 PM.
3. It is expected from the parents and the authorized guests to make their entry in the Visitors Register and also mention their relation with the Hostel resident.
4. In all circumstances, Hostel Residents will intimate their absence for the night with the written permission of the Warden and they have to sign in the leave register during office hours.
5. Hostel Residents shall be permitted to meet their local guardians only on Sundays and other holidays with the prior permission of the Warden.
6. Hostel Residents will mark their presence personally at the place notified for attendance time.
7. The gates of the Hostels will be immediately closed after the attendance. Late entry without prior permission shall be taken as a serious offence. Hostel Residents entering the Hostel late shall register their entry in the register kept for the said purpose.
8. The hostels timings for the girls in throughout the year (summers and winters) shall be upto 09.30 pm. However, the entry in the Campus will be upto 09.00 pm only. These timings can be changed anytime by the authorities.
9. Hostel Residents who enter the Hostel after the time of entry can be fined as follows:
 - (a) Upto 07.00 p.m. No fine
 - (b) 07:00 p.m. to 07:30 p.m. Rs. 50/-
 - (c) 07:30 p.m. to 08:00 p.m. Rs. 100/-
 - (d) After 18:00 p.m. Rs.500/- (with permission from Warden and information to the parents regarding the late entry)
9. Hostel residents who remain absent from the hostel without the prior permission of the Warden shall be fined Rs. 100/- per night and **such absence will be brought to the notice of their parents.** The Warden would take suitable action against such defaulters and give his recommendation to expel them from the hostel.
11. Old Students/guests will not be allowed to stay in the Hostel. Grand Mother/Mother of Hostel Resident can stay in the Hostel for two days per semester without any charge. However, she will have to pay Rs. 100/- per day for over stay. Real sister can also be allowed to stay in the Hostel after identification. She can stay by making a payment of Rs. 100/- per day.

MESS RULES

1. Provision of breakfast, lunch and dinner is made in the Hostels. Students are encouraged to take all the three meals during their stay in the hostel.
2. Messes will function under the direct supervision and control of the Wardens who will be assisted by a student representative.
3. During vacation and training/official tour the students have to seek the prior permission from the Wing coordinator/Principals of College/ and will inform to hostel warden. If a student does not want to take food in hostel mess on medical ground, he/she has to deposit the prescription slip issued by the Medical Officer of SGAD College. After that he/she will be allowed the prescribed diet for the suggested days.
4. Food will not be served before or after the mess timings, nor will it be served in the Room except in case of illness, with the permission of the Warden. Hostel Resident or the Mess steward can be fined for violating this rule.
5. Mess employees will be under the control of the Warden only, whom he/she can suspend or award any other punishment for any kind of lapse. A hostel Resident can't punish the employees but they can file complaint against them to the Warden.
6. Taking crockery, utensils and furniture out of the Mess/kitchen or dining hall to the Hostel Room is strictly prohibited.
7. Before getting their Examination Roll Number, the Hostel Residents will obtain a "No Dues" certificate after paying the dues of their Mess Bills. All the dues must be cleared before vacating the Hostel. The names of the violators will be sent to the concerned wing not to issue them the Roll Number or declare their result. Other disciplinary action can also be taken against them in this regard.

HOSTEL FEE

1. Hostel dues (Annexure IV) are to be paid on or before the specified date. A hostel resident who fails to pay any kind of dues for more than two months will have to vacate the hostel room.
2. Under exceptional circumstances any old student/some project fellow/student from other approved institutions of India and abroad visiting SGAD College for academic or research purpose willing to stay in the hostel, can do so with the recommendation of concerned faculty member (under whom they would be working), coordinator and prior permission of the competent authority for a specific period of time decided on case-to-case basis subject to the availability of accommodation. Such students will have to pay Rs. 100/- per day on guest entry basis and such students will also have to the mess charges. All hostel and mess rules are also applicable on such students.
3. If a student after admission in hostel surrenders his/her seat from the course, before taking possession of his/her room in the hostel the entire fee collected from the student after deduction of processing fee Rs. 500/- will be refunded. However, if the student leaves after taking possession of a room, then the hostel fee deposited by her/him will be refunded after deducting room rent for the complete month of his/her stay rounded off to complete month and a processing fee of Rs.1000/-.

There is no guarantee that every applicant will get Hostel accommodation. Hostel accommodation shall be provided on the basis of availability of Rooms and as per rules.

Prohibition, Prevention & Punishment for Ragging

Prohibition of Ragging

1. No person shall practice ragging in any form within or outside the premises of an educational institution.
2. Any person who indulge in ragging on conviction, may be punished with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to three years or with fine, which may extend to fifty thousand rupees or both.

Preliminary Enquiry/Action

3. (i) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parents or guardian or a teacher of an educational institution or an Officer-in-Charge makes a complaint, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational Institution, the head of that educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within twenty-four hours of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into it and, if, *prima facie*, it is found true, suspend the student found guilty.
(ii) Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational Institution, it is proved that *prima facie* there is no substance in the complaint received; he shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant.
4. Every single incident of ragging where the victim or his parents or guardian or the head of educational Institution is not satisfied with the institutional arrangement of action, a First Information Report (FIR) shall be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.

Offence to be cognizable, non-bailable and compoundable

5. (1) Any student convicted of an offence under this Ordinance shall be expelled from the educational institution.
(i) Student expelled on account of ragging shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion.

Note: As per the UGC Regulations ID.O.No.1-15/2009 (ARC) pt, III, dated October 16, 2020, is mandatory for the student and his/her parents to submit an on anti-ragging affidavit at www.antiragging.in at the time of admission.

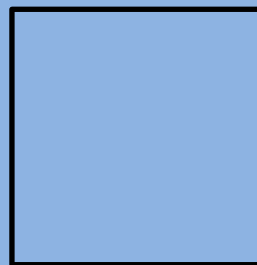
